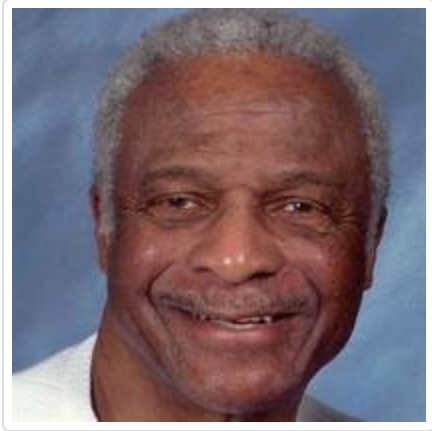




Clyde Huff,
